  - 3.3.2 More than half of the respondent feels fair (55%) about the curriculum is match with current trends followed by good with 42.6% response rate.
  - 3.3.3 Half of the alumni (51%) feels good about semester system which is competent to both national and global trends followed by fair with response rate 46.8%.
  - 3.3.4 About half of the respondent (53%) feels fair in availability curriculum oriented of study materials in market followed by good (46.8%).
  - 3.3.5 Half of the alumni (51%) feels that the course undertaken was fairly challenging and constructive followed by goods with response rate (46.8%).
  - 3.3.6 More than half (57.4%) of the alumni find good the depth and load of course content followed by fair with response rate (42.6%).
  - 3.3.7 About half of the alumni (51%) assess the undergraduate program as good followed by fair with response rate 49%.
  - 3.3.8 Nearly two third of the responded (70%) rated as good the sequence of the courses followed b fair (30%).
  - 3.3.9 More than half of the alumni (55.3%) feels that the curriculum helps in improvement of inter and intrapersonal skills followed by good (44.7%).
  - 3.3.10 Three fifth of the respondent rated (61.7%) the curriculum is relevant to job and future aspiration followed by fair(38%).

# 3.4 Feedback of the Parents:

- 3.4.1 More than half of the parents (65.2%) rated as good for transformation of their child after course completion followed by excellent (21.7%).
- 3.4.2 Half of the respondent (50.7%) rated as good for the remedial classes followed by fair(33.3%).
- 3.4.3 More than half of the parents (53.6%) rate the curriculum bases job placement followed by fair(31.9%).
- 3.4.4 More than half of the parents (53.6%) rate the additional courses offered by the college followed by fair(31.3%).
- 3.4.5 About three fifth of the parents (56.5%) rate as fair for the depth and load of course content followed by good(37.7%).

### Students' feedback

From the students' feedback, it is clear that regarding the completion of the syllabus by the teacher, 31.41 percent of students responded that the completion of the syllabus by the teacher is excellent, 63.97 percent of students responded it as good, 12.70 percent considered it as fair and rest 3.43 percent of students considered it as poor. Perhaps the last two groups of students are either slow learners or irregular students.

It is seen that 23.33 percent of students rated their satisfaction regarding the understanding of chapter or course taught by the teachers as excellent, 68.63 percent rated as good and the rest 5.77 percent rated as fair and only 2.54 percent students are not satisfied with understanding of chapter or course taught by the teachers.

Regarding the design of the curriculum to enhance their employability, it is clear that 27.71 percent of students responded strongly agree option, 63.51 percent of students agreed with this point,9.47 percent of students disagreed and 5.31 percent students responded this statement as strongly disagree. This indicates that majority of students responded positively regarding the design of the curriculum to enhance their employability and a few considered that the curriculum is not designed to enhance their employability. The curriculum developer must give more emphasis to include more contents regarding the enhancement of employability skills of the students.

Regarding relevance of courses and revised of course at reasonable intervals, 23.79 percent of students choose strongly agree option, 69.51 percent responded the agree option and a few choose disagree and strongly disagree options i.e., 5.08 percent and 1.62 percent respectively.

11.32 percent of students responded that the courses they have studied enhanced their knowledge, skills and capabilities.86.60 percent of students reacted agree option in this point. Only 2.07 percent students disagreed with this statement. No students were strongly disagreed with this point.

96.54 percent of students opined that the carrier counseling cell of the college has organized workshop or seminar for carrier development. 3.46 percent of students negatively reacted with this point which is not so much significant. Perhaps they are not actively involved in workshops or seminars and they may be absentee in workshops or seminars organized by the college.

It is seen that 93.07 percent of students opined that the expectation from their department were satisfactory, whereas 6.93 percent were against of it.

It is seen that 86.60 percent of students' interaction with the administration of the college is good and 13.16 percent of students opined that the interaction with the administration of the college is poor.

Evaluating the feedback from students, it is found that the course followed by this college is suitable to enhance knowledge, skills and capabilities of students. The authority must try to attract the students to interact with them and try to create feelings that the authority is their friend, philosopher and guide.

# TEACHERS' FEEDBACK:

Regarding Teachers' feedback, it is found that 26.92 percent of teachers strongly agreed with the view that the course or syllabi taught by them have a good balance between theory and application, 73.7 percent of teachers agreed with this view, no one is disagreed, neither or nor disagreed with this view. This proves that syllabi or course taught by them is valid as well as reliable too.

It is seen that 26.92 percent of teachers strongly agreed with the view that the objectives of syllabi are well defined; 73.7 percent of teaches agreed with this view; no one is disagreed, neither or nor disagreed with this view. This proves that the objectives of syllabi taught by them are relevant and suitable for students.

The feedback by the teachers exhibits that 26.92 percent of teachers strongly agreed with the view that books or journals etc. prescribed or listed as reference materials are relevant, update and cover the entire syllabi and 73.7 percent of teachers agreed with this view; no one is disagreed, neither or nor disagreed with this view. It shows a positive point of the college.

The feedback by the teachers shows that 38.42 percent of teachers strongly agreed with the view that the course or syllabi of the subjects taught by them increased their interest, knowledge, and perspective in the subject area;61.54 percent of teachers agreed with this view; no one is disagreed, neither or nor disagreed with this view.

It is seen that 73.7 percent of teachers agreed that the college has given them full freedom to adopt new techniques in teaching learning process and 26.92 percent of them strongly agreed to the same statement. It is found that 15.38 percent of teachers strongly agreed with the statement that they have enough freedom to adopt new strategies of testing and assessment of students' achievement; 84.61 percent of teachers were agreed with this statement. No one is disagreed, neither or nor disagreed with this statement. It reflects that the college has provided full freedom to the teachers to adopt new strategies of testing and assessment of students' achievement.

23.8 percent of teachers are strongly agreed with the statement that tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus and 76.93 percent of them agreed with this statement. It shows a positive aspect of the college regarding examination and evaluation.

80 percent of teachers responded that the prescribed books are available in the library in sufficient numbers, 7.69 percent teachers are strongly agreed with this statement. Only 7.7 percent were disagreed and 3.85 percent were neither agreed nor disagreed with this statement. This indicates that the library of the said college has availability of books.

73.7 percent of teachers agreed that the environment in the college is conducive to teaching. 23.8 percent of them were strongly agreed to this statement. 88.46 percent of teachers were agreed that the college provides adequate opportunities and support to faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications and 7.69 percent of them were strongly agreed with this statement. No any disagree response was found in this statement. Only 3.85 percent of them were neither agreed nor disagreed with this statement. So, we may conclude that the college environment is always supportive to faculty members.

84.61 percent of teachers opined that ICT facilities in the college are adequate and satisfactory and 7.69 percent of them were strongly agreed with this statement. 7.7 percent of them were neither agreed nor disagreed to this statement. No any disagree response was found in this statement. So, we may conclude that the college environment is always supportive to faculty members.

100 percent of library staffs opined that ICT facilities in the college are adequate and satisfactory. The response shows that ICT facilities are also sufficient in the college premises.

100 percent of library staffs opined that the separate space in the canteen is available for teachers; the classrooms are clean and well maintained. So it is clear that the canteen and the classroom are adequate and healthy for the library staffs of the college.

Only 2 percent alumni were not satisfied regarding the availability of materials and references. So, we may conclude that the alumni of this college have a positive attitude regarding the availability of materials and references.

Regarding the statement that 'the course offered under your programme was challenging and constructive', 50 percent of alumni reacted it as good and another 50 percent reacted it as fair. So, we may conclude that the alumni of this college have a positive attitude regarding the programme.

60 percent of alumni rated that the depth and load of course content was good, 40 percent rated it as fair. We may conclude that depth and load of course content did not hamper them in learning process.

For 66 percent of alumni, the B.A. Programme offered by the college was good,34 percent rated it as fair. It proves that the programme offered by the college was adequate and valuable according to the needs of the alumni. Regarding the sequence of the courses included in the programme, 62 percent of alumni rated it as good, 38 percent rated it as fair .So we may conclude that the sequence of the programme offered by the college has positive aspects.

52 percent of alumni rated that the curriculum helped them to improve their inter and interpersonal skills, 48 percent of them rated it as fair. So, we may conclude that the curriculum followed by this college is suitable to improve the inter and interpersonal skills of Alumni.

60 percent of alumni rated that the curriculum was relevant to their job and future aspirations, 40 percent of them rated the statement as fair. This is also a positive point of the college.

# PARENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS:

From parents' feedback, it is found that 45 percent of parents rated the transformation of their children after the completion of the courses as excellent, 48.33 percent rated it as good and the rest 6.66 percent of them rated it as fair.

Regarding the rating of the extent of remedial classes for the slow learners, 45 percent of parents rated it as excellent, 35 percent rated it as good, 20 percent of them rated it as fair. It proves that the college has given special emphasis on remedial classes for slow learners.

40 percent of parents rated excellent regarding that the curriculum is helpful to improve inter and interpersonal skills of students, 35 percent of them rated it as good and 25 percent of parents rated it as fair. The positive responses to this statement indicate that the curriculum followed by this college is helpful for improving the qualities as well as developing the skills of students.

It is seen from Parents' feedback that 23.33 percent of parents rated the extent of exposure to other curricular activities as excellent, 58.33 percent rated it as good ,18.33 percent rated it as fair.

It is found that 36.66 percent of parents rated the quality and relevance of the courses included in the semester as excellent, 48.33 percent rated it as good and 25 percent rated it as fair. Such type of positive responses of parents indicates that this affiliated college is able to maintain the validity and reliability of the course effectively.

Regarding the opportunities for self-learning in the curriculum 36.66 percent of parents rated it as excellent, 45 percent rated it as good and the rest of 18.33 percent of them rated it as fair. From such type of rating, it is clear that the college encouraged the students for self-learning by adopting a student friendly curriculum.

Regarding the availability of text and references books in the market, NLIST, DELNET, websites and college library, 26.66 percent of parents rated it as excellent; 55 percent of parents rated it as good, 18.33 percent rated it as fair. So, we may conclude that the parents of the students have a positive attitude regarding the availability of text and references.



The feedback analysis shows that 93.2% of the students were aware of the facilities provided by the CBCS. 52.16% of the students found that teachers covering the syllabus and their understanding of the courses was excellent. 60.8% of the students agreed that the curriculum was designed to enhance employability for them. 59.3% of the students agreed that the courses they studied were relevant and contents were revised at the reasonable intervals. 61.2% of the students agreed that the courses they studied enhanced their knowledge. 91.5% of the students said that career counselling cell have been organizing workshops and webinars for students' knowledge enhancement. 50.9% of the students found that their expectation from their department was satisfactory and excellent. 61.2% of the students found that their interaction with the administration of the college was good. 61% of the students assessed that their interaction with the office staff was good, 57.2% of the students assessed that their view about the library was good. 44.9% of the students of the opinion that they have been looking out for a job after graduation, 59.8% of the students found that teachers refered to latest development in teaching learning process was very good. 49.7% of the students felt that the faculty members were very good, they were available and helpful. 82.6% of the sudents found that teacher have been taking full class every time as per the alloted time. 83.6% of the students were of the opinion that teachers always encouraged their participation and discussion in the classroom, 52.4% of them agreed that teachers discussed the subject in detail. 51.4% of the students agreed that teachers had taken classes with complete undersanding. 81% of the students found that the teachers were always available for counseling and guidance in the academic matters. 52.8% of the students found that the teachers possesed deeper knowledge on the subject. 51.2 % of them felt that the holdings of the courses in the library was good. 85.8% of the students were of the opinion that the college had COVID-19 awareness programme . 79.1% of the students felt that the college had tajen steps to prevent COVID-19 infection. 86.7% of the students were of the opinion that they would join BLB College Alumni Association (BLBCAA).


- The feedback of teachers was collected from a total of 21 teachers of the BLB College, Sivasagar.




